Report on Financial Statements

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial statements relating to <u>Rise Foundation</u> which comprises the Balance Sheet as on 31st March, 2024, Statement of Income & Expenditure Account and Statement of Receipt & Payment Account for the period from 01st April, 2023 to 31st March, 2024 and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies. In our opinion, and to the best of our information and according to the explanation given to us, the financial statements give a true and fair view of the financial position of the institution as at 31st March, 2024 and of its financial performance for the year then ended in accordance with the Accounting Standards issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI).

Basis of Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing (SAs) issued by ICAI. Significant Accounting Policies & Notes of Accounts

1. Significant Accounting Policies:
